## Why honor your work with a license?

- Your work is automatically protected by copyright
- Everybody may read
- Colleagues must ask permission to
  - ✓ build on it
  - ✓ copy it
  - ✓ use it in speeches or in class
  - ✓ etc.

### How to apply a license

- 1. Choose a license: <a href="https://creativecommons.org/choose/?lang=en">https://creativecommons.org/choose/?lang=en</a>
- 2. Insert the appropriate CC icon: <a href="https://creativecommons.org/about/downloads">https://creativecommons.org/about/downloads</a>
- 3. Add some text like: "This work is licensed under a Creative Commons Attribution 4.0 International License"
- 4. Insert a hyperlink from your licensing text to the very license (see No. 1)

The reader now has legal clarity.
